## RE: Need for Increase in FY 2023 EFSP Humanitarian Assistance Funding

Dear Speaker Pelosi, Leader McCarthy, Leader Schumer, and Leader McConnell,

The undersigned 101 organizations, which include thirty-four (34) direct service providers along the U.S.-Mexico border, urge Congress to increase Fiscal Year 2023 funding for the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Emergency Food and Shelter Program (EFSP) to \$200,000,000 to meet the needs of local communities providing critical services for families and individuals encountered by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security.

Through a national board, FEMA awards humanitarian assistance funding to faith-based and other nonprofit organizations, states, and municipalities that provide respite and food to migrants released from U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement or U.S. Customs and Border Protection custody. Many shelters, cities, and counties critically rely on support from EFSP to maintain safe environments so that migrants are not stranded and can reach their final destinations.

We are grateful for the \$150,000,000 Congress appropriated to the program for FY 2022 and its inclusion in the September 30, 2022 Continuing Resolution, but urge you to consider an increase in the appropriation in light of the increased demands faced by service providers.<sup>1</sup> Appropriated funds have already been stretched thin. The EFSP national board recently released an addendum to its FY 2022 Humanitarian Relief Funding Guidance, noting that, "limited funding remain[ed]" and announcing criteria for triaging requests.<sup>2</sup> Because of this, there is concern that there are insufficient funds remaining to get shelters and localities through to December 16, 2022.

As the expiration of the current continuing resolution approaches, we urge Congress to reaffirm its commitment to border and other communities by providing \$200,000,000 or more for FY23. If Congress does not pass an FY 2023 appropriations bill, we implore Congress to provide additional funding in a successive Continuing Resolution.
